### By train

#### *Denmark Hill station*

King's is about five minutes' walk from Denmark Hill train station. The station is served by regular, direct rail links to central London at Blackfriars, Victoria and St Pancras International as well as to principal stops in south-east London such as Bromley South, Catford, Lewisham and Peckham Rye. From December 2012, the London Overground from Surrey Quays to Clapham Junction will also stop at the station. *More information can be found at: [www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk)*

#### *Loughborough Junction station*

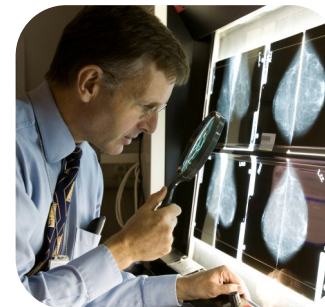

### **Observation of clinical breast radiology practice:**

## Application process

1. Forward your curriculum vitae along with a covering letter stating your aims and objectives and dates you would like to come and for how long.
2. Please send us a letter of reference from your Manager on letter headed paper with a contact telephone number.
3. Your application will be checked by a Consultant for approval. Once your application is approved we will liaise to agree a start date.
4. You will be required to obtain Observer Agreement as all Medical Practitioners who are not substantive employees of the Trust require an Observer Agreement and, where appropriate, Professional Registration if they are to care for, or be treating patients or participating in the treatment of patients as part of their attachment.
5. A letter from the training centre will be sent out confirming all the necessary details.
